Get Up Eight, is told by her daughter, Normal resident Susan Woollen, and it shapes broader narratives about the devastation of war, nuclear weapons and the immigration of Japanese War Brides to the United States. Beyond her war experiences, Chiyono's story also includes rich descriptions of Japanese traditions, culture, and history.
